Spain is a traditionally Catholic culture with a secular modern society. There is still a big need to Church plant in towns and areas where there are none or very few Evangelical Churches. Trevor and Manoli Allan, a missionary couple from Australia are church planting in the North West region of Spain and also reaching out to pilgrims who come to do the Camino walk to Santiago. Over half a million pilgrims from all over the world do this walk every year.
