Trevor & Manoli Allan, (Spain, DPG Day 1)

Our summer is past, but God continues to bring pilgrims in daily. Marianne arrived tired and sick. She had been walking for over 2 months all the way from Belgium looking for God. Being sick, she stayed for two days resting. Our great cook made her a special soup. Victor and Rosi, the couple of evangelists who work daily with us on the Camino, shared the Gospel and while sitting together in a quiet place in the garden, she gave her life to Jesus. Later, she went on to Madrid to look for work, and we put her in contact with a Church there. The latest we have heard is that she is on fire for Jesus. She found what she had been searching for. We are hoping to build a multi-purpose community hall on the block of land that we have behind the Albergue. This would give us more showers and toilets and room for more pilgrims and provide us with a bigger meeting space for the growing Church plant in Ribadeo, and a covered area for the youth retreats and camps that we run. My co-worker Ruth's house has been stripped of floor and walls, with belongings scattered to the four winds. Her water buffalo is drowned. Her rice crop is laying sodden on the ground. Despite that, she is rousing up our volunteers to help the needy. Please pray for Ruth and Team Kanlungan (refuge) as they work so very hard in the face of massive needs. Please pray for wisdom in how to both respond to this emergency and take care of the urgent and the routine in the Itulos Valley.

24th Nov I head back to school in Bilbao! Language options here in Vitoria just haven't been great, so I'm returning to Bilbao for a 5-hour-a-day class for the next few months. She is out of surgery and doing well, although she has a lot of pain. So now we wait as her body recovers and they slowly start letting out the liquid until they find the right balance for her.
