Gary & Joanne Akehurst, (NSW, DPG Day 1)

We're so thankful to the Lord for the last 3 years that Joanne has been off chemotherapy, but we knew the myeloma markers would increase at some time. While her general health is still quite reasonable, her myeloma markers had increased markedly when she was tested in December 2025. Since then she has had lots of tests and has just started an immunotherapy drug trial. She will have to go to RPA for the first 8 weeks, then once a fortnight for 2 months and eventually the frequency of injections reduces to every 3 months. We would appreciate your prayers.

Language study has been fairly intense, but I am so thankful to the Lord for this opportunity as I know it will help me immensely when I return to Taiwan. Praise God that I have met 3 new "harvest workers" from Korea, who are also in the same language program. Please pray for the roughly 2 billion Muslims worldwide, including about 245 million in Indonesia, who are currently fasting during Ramadan. Pray that they will come to know the One who is the only way, the only truth, and the only life.

Having just concluded a child protection awareness seminar, please pray for real steps forward, for ways to engage tribal leaders (who have much authority over children and over their parents), and for the Lord to block the resistance of the enemy of souls to the protection of the vulnerable. Our health workers are learning to identify what an emergency is, and how to respond.
